ADDENDUM #1

1. Are you able to provide the dimensions of the current signs? Are they all approximately the same size?

All 19 signs are 28” x 44”

2. Pertaining to the following section of the RFP:

"1.16 Nova Scotia Worker's Compensation: The successful Proponent must be registered and remain in good standing with NS WCB throughout the term of a contract issued pursuant to this RFP."

We are open to receiving bids that are registered and in good standing with any provincial WCB equivalent outside the province on NS.

3. Pertaining to the following section of the RFP:

"2.2 Scope of Work: Integrate Mi'kmaq and other historically underrepresented communities where appropriate"

Does the Town of Lunenburg have existing relationships in place with Mi'kmaq community members for consultation and guidance on content additions, or is the successful proponent expected to help establish and support those connections as part of the project?

At this time, the Town does not have fully established consultation relationships broadly, with the exception of the Labrador family, whose ancestors are referenced in Panel 13 (Merligueche).

Mi'kmaq (and Acadian) consultation is anticipated for a limited number of panels based on subject matter, specifically:

- Panel 12 (Defence)
- Panel 13 (Merligueche)
- Panel 14 (Settlement of the Foreign Protestants)
- Panel 19 (The Waterfront Today)

For these panels, the successful proponent will be expected to help establish and support appropriate Mi'kmaq consultation as part of the project scope and should reflect this in their proposed approach, schedule, and pricing. The remaining panels are not expected to require the same level of consultation.

We hope this clarification is helpful, and we welcome proponents to outline their proposed approach to consultation in their submission.
